


SAVEWAYS SUPERMARKET

Further afield a new black-owned international supermarket, Saveways supermarket, has opened in Croydon and is located inside a warehouse so offers a huge variety of products. The store was launched by artists Krept and Konan and offers products from food to hair and hygiene products, their mission is to serve local black and minority ethnicity communities. All the meat at Saveways is halal from the prepackaged products on the shelf to the butcher kiosk instore.



OGB6 BEAUTY PALACE

In Crystal Palace you can find OGB6 Beauty Palace, a salon at the back of a hair supply store. Allowing customers to buy hair without a deposit or get one of their many services – from box braids to French curls and Senegalese twists. The salon is black owned and offers reasonable prices.

AYAN HAIR AND BEAUTY

Ayan Hair and Beauty, located in Kingston town centre is an Afro and European cosmetic shop, offering products for every hair type. Most major hair care brands can be found in store and are well priced according to their customer reviews.



AFRICAN QUEEN FABRICS

For traditional clothing and fabric, <u>African</u> <u>Queen Fabrics</u> is a one-stop-shop located in Brixton Village offering jewellery, fabrics, clothing and accessories.

IMONE, ZAZZA AND SEOUL PLAZA

For authentic Asian food not far from Kingston is New Malden, which has a reputation across London for being a hub of excellent Korean and Japanese cuisine. **Imone** is a family run restaurant offering authentic Korean food. Another great option in New Malden is Zazza, in a hidden location behind a mini mart. If you enter Seoul Plaza and walk to the back, you will find a sliding door that takes you into a small family run business that offers the best of Korean Chinese cuisine and makes handmade noodles fresh every day.

London is a great city to try authentic cuisines from all over the world, whatever you may be looking for can be found here. One of the best Ethiopian restaurants the city has to offer can be dining and lots of vegan options.

TWENTIES FINE

For cinema loving women of colour there is a London based film club called Twenties Fine, that offers monthly meet ups where attendees watch a film and have group games and discussions to follow. To learn about their upcoming events, you can join their mailing list.

SOUTHBANK'S HAYWARD GALLERY

Southbank's Hayward is located at the Southbank Centre. (<u>Gallery Hayward Gallery | Southbank Centre</u>). It's a world renowned contemporary art gallery which has exhibitions celebrating ethnic minorities that run all year-round. It embraces underrepresented voices, fosters global dialogue, and invites audiences from all backgrounds to engage with innovative exhibitions.

KINGSTON'S LIVE MUSIC



Kingston is a hub for live music, with many nightlife venues offering performances on a regular basis. Ram Jam Records and The Fighting Cocks Bar in London's Kingston Upon Thames are both intimate venues that host gigs for local artists. For more mainstream artists check out Banquet Records. Circuit is Kingston's newest and biggest club, expect unique concepts and wicked experiences in 2 rooms of essential music.

FARRAGO

For unique events that showcase underground artists from all mediums check out <u>Farrago</u>, a creative community that regularly host events across London. The location and event changes monthly but previously Farrago have held events showcasing only Asian women DJs and many of the artists platformed are people of colour at the start of their creative careers. Farrago events offer visual performances, fashion shows and live music.

COMMUNITY CENTRE AND LOCAL CHARITY

YMCA HAWKER

Situated beside the Thames, YMCA Hawker offers facilities such as a gym, group exercise classes, a Reformer Pilates studio, and children's activities including soft play. They also provide tennis coaching and have a cafe for social gatherings.

KINGSTON HIVE

A volunteer-run climate emergency centre located next to Kingston Station. Kingston Hive hosts events like home energy advice sessions, upcycling workshops, and vegan cooking demonstrations, aiming to empower residents to adopt sustainable lifestyles.

MIND IN KINGSTON

Mind in Kingston is an independent charity affiliated with National Mind, providing services to support individuals with mental health issues. Their offerings include crisis support, resources, and various projects aimed at improving mental well-being.

VOICES OF HOPE

Voices of Hope focuses on bringing hope to individuals and the community through projects related to food, creative arts, and women's support. Initiatives include community choirs, the BRITE Box project providing healthy meal kits, and the Pearl Project supporting survivors of gender-based abuse.

KINGSTON WELCARE

Kingston WelCare is a friendly space offering support to parents and families. Services include drop-in family sessions, a cafe with a play area, various events and activities, and assistance for parents facing mental health challenges.
