I will advocate for stronger cost-of-living support for students so everyone can participate in university life without financial stress. I will work with the Student Union to promote initiatives such as more frequent free breakfasts, access to essential toiletries and menstrual products, and clearer housing support resources. I will also push for better funding opportunities for sports clubs and societies, helping spreading participation costs and making activities more accessible for all students. This will be actioned by stronger communication and follow-up protocols with the Union allowing students feel that their concerns are being addressed continuously, helping students focus on learning, education security and building sense of self.

I will introduce a programme that will connect students who want someone to study with, attend events together, or somebody they can try sports and societies for the first time with. Many students, especially new, international, or commuter students, can find it difficult to meet people or get involved in campus life. By creating this peer support network, students can build friendships, gain confidence, and feel more comfortable participating in activities. Volunteers will also gain mentoring and leadership experience while helping create a more welcoming and inclusive student community at Kingston.

My manifestos are about real, actionable changes for students: not empty promises, but built on improving systems that exist. These changes include easier commuting, practical cost-of-living assistance and stronger support networks. These pledges focus on issues that affect students every day and aim to make campus life more accessible and inclusive.
